LEGACY AWARD

LEGACY defined... "The long lasting impact of events or actions that took place in the past, or of a person's life."

It was in the early 1940's in the city of Nassau, New Providence, The Bahamas, when Cleveland LeRoy Mitchell was the benefactor of the strict yet spiritual and well-rounded teaching of the Benedictine monks from St. Johns Abbey of Collegeville, Minnesota. These determined priests were instrumental in building the 1st Catholic secondary school - St Augustine's School on the northwest corner of the church grounds of St. Francis Xavier Church, on West and West Hill Streets. The school was housed in the two storey building called "The Niche". LeRoy was a part of the inaugural class of St. Augustine's. He also displayed his athletic prowess as captain of several basketball teams on the historic basketball court on the Priory. The beautiful, talented, and demure Paula Louise Albury was the Captain of the Setons Club female basketball team, which also practiced and played on the same court. At first Mom was enrolled in "The Government High School", but was persuaded by Fr. Brendan Forsythe, OSB to transfer to Xaviers College for a Catholic education -- where subsequently she graduated. Xaviers College was an all-girls school under the management and tutelage of the Sisters of Charity from New York.

This historic spot of The Priory, was the hub where many sporting, social and liturgical activities took place. Fr. Brendan, became match-maker in the courtship of "Mitchelli" (as he was known) and the young Paula. After three years of courtship, on August 27, 1951 this handsome and respected couple were married in St. Francis Xavier Church by their match-maker. In true Catholic form, eight children were born of that union: Therese(deceased), Paulette, Peter, Michael (deceased), Elizabeth, Marie, Myra and Michelle. This began *THE MITCHELL LEGACY*.

Regular church attendance and participation became an integral part of our lives, abased by the stellar examples set by our parents. LeRoy, the focused and dedicated liturgical churchman, served as the Official Diocesan Master of Ceremonies assisting the bishop(s) and priests whenever called upon. Mom was a trailblazer in her own right, having served the (Arch)Diocese of Nassau for over 45 years of uninterrupted service in the Chancery Office before retiring in 2001. She held the titles of Archivist, Notary and Judge Delegate – Marriage Tribunal, and Vice Chancellor – with the distinction of being the first female and lay person in each role. In 1998, she was awarded the title "Dame" of the Order of St. Gregory by Pope (St.) John Paul II for her exemplary dedicated service. Both parents were heavily involved in numerous parish and diocesan groups, clubs and committees such as, the Parish Council, Diocesan Pastoral Council, Christian Family Movement (CFM), To Encounter Christ (TEC) and Cursillo, to name a few.

As the Benedictine Monks formed their lives, our parents also formed each of our lives with Catholicism as the base. Discipline and education, sprinkled with lots of love and fun was the hallmark. Each member of the family received their sacraments in St. Francis Xavier Cathedral Parish. The children continue to be involved in the building up of the church in various areas: as Director of the Catholic Archdiocesan Annual Appeal (CAAA) and in ministries such as: Lector/Commentator, Catechist for CCD and RCIA (children and adult Catholic formation), as CAAA committee member and/or donors, Choir, altar server, Eucharistic ministry, Altar Guild, visiting the sick/shut-ins, New Cathedral Building Fund Committee, TEC, and Koinonia.

Each of LeRoy and Paula's children attended primary school at St. Francis and/or Xaviers College (Lower School), followed by Daddy's beloved St. Augustine's College for secondary education. Both of Marie's children (3rd generation) Elizabeth and Jeffrey Rodgers Jr. also followed in these footsteps. At SAC, LeRoy for many years served as PTA President and as Inaugural President of SACA. It was also a given that we each would continue to complete a minimum Bachelor's degree despite the cost and sacrificial undertaking for our parents.

While matriculating at SAC, each of the second and third generations also followed the path of the school's and our parents endeveour, to be well rounded citizens of service with "Christ as our Light". Each of us became involved in extracurricular activities at school and out of school. On campus, each of us was involved in two or more of the following: varsity sports including – basketball, volleyball, softball, track and field, netball, swimming; served on the Student Council, The Augustine (newspaper), The Beacon (yearbook), Anchor Club, Interpretive Dance, The Spinnerettes (baton majorettes), Junior Achievement, and/or the Ecology Club. Elizabeth (Mitchell-Daxon) also returned to SAC as an Accounting Teacher for 13 years. Our clubs outside of school included ballet / dance, basketball, photography, track and field, soccer, orinthology, neighborhood watch, tennis and piano. Moreover, in the wider community of The Bahamas

and in Florida, the Mitchell's are involved in giving service, uplifting the marginalized, mentoring, involved in social action, counselling and countless clean up campaigns. Like the Patriarch and Matriarch, we have also held local, regional and international leadership positions in our fraternal organizations – Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc. and Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc., as well as The Bahamas Primary School Student of The Year Foundation, Toastmasters, Junior Achievement, not to mention the various leadership positions in the church and workplace.

Marie (Catholic Board of Education – Education Administrator) - MBA, BA; Part of the 1st transitional class from British form (1-5) system to American grade (7-12) system; "Wear your St. Augustine's uniform with dignity and pride wherever you go!";
