Award Description: The Distinguished Alumni Award honors SAC alumni who have exhibited outstanding professional accomplishments, exemplary leadership, and dedicated service to their communities and SAC/Alumni Association. Nominees are expected to have made a positive impact locally and/or internationally, demonstrating integrity and high character. This award acknowledges both the enduring contributions and consistent achievements throughout the recipient's professional career and may not be conferred annually

Justification: Jeffery Leonard Lloyd has been a Servant Leader as evidenced throughout his life - He is the epitome of a "SACER"! He has achieved eminence in his colored professional life, which spans fields of education, media, communication, law, religion and business. He has made significant contributions to SAC as a student, educator, Deputy Dean, Parent (all of his children attended SAC), alumnus, and benefactor. He has been a pioneer, record-breaking innovative leader both nationally and internationally, where he left his positive footprint on many organizations and people - most notably he established the Youth Empowerment & Skills Training Institute (YEAST), The Bahamas' first (and to date, ONLY) residential alternative educational program for academically and vocationally-challenged young males. This program has successfully and positively changed the lives of over 1,000 at-risk Bahamian young males and their families during the 13-year run. Additionally, with the sponsorship of Bahama, Mr. Lloyd founded The Leadership Development Institute (LDI), which helped to engineer the social and career development of thousands of underserved, vocationally deprived Bahamian young people. Culturally, The Bahamas Ministry of Youth and Culture appointed him to organize and lead the New Providence Junkanoo Parade for the 2015/2016 festival season arguably one of the best organized and executed Junkanoo festival seasons to date; and whose blueprint is still in use.
